In 2008, she served as an international humanitarian law advisor for the defense of several Guantanamo detainees and monitored military commissions in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. From 2004-2007, Nicole worked for the International Criminal Tribunal for the Former Yugoslavia in The Hague, both as a legal officer for the Appeals Chamber and as a trial lawyer for the Prosecution. Noonan in the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit in San Francisco and from 2001-2002 she was a law clerk to the Honorable Gerard E. Lynch in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York in New York City. Nicole graduated from Columbia Law School in 2001, where she was a Harlan Fiske Stone Scholar and the Articles Editor of the *Columbia Human Rights Law Review*. She received a Masters in International Affairs, with honors, from the School of International and Public Affairs (SIPA) in 1995 and a B.A. from Stanford University in 1991.
